GENDER TRAINING

Gender Training sessions were conducted across multiple locations in September 2024. The first session took place at BDDS, Ballari on September 10th and 11th, followed by CMSSS, Hassan on September 12th and 13th, and CODP, Mangalore on September 17th and 18th.





These sessions aimed to increase awareness and understanding of gender issues, promote equality, and empower participants to integrate gender-sensitive approaches into their work. The training engaged participants through interactive discussions, case studies, and practical exercises designed to enhance their knowledge and skills.

SUCCESSFUL RICE TRADING VENTURE

Smt. Sharadamma a widow lives in a village called Hatti-famous for Gold mining in Lingasgoor thaluk of Raichur district. She has three children two girls and a boy; though she wanted to give good education to her children but she is not able to because she had no other income except her daily wage earning. She always thought of taking up some income generating activity to earn better so that she can take better care of her family, but there was neither opportunity nor guidance in this regard. Fortunately she became a member in one of the 15 SHGs formed by the BDDS diocese in Ballary district, the name of her sangha is "Sony". She started attending all the programs organized by the sangha and actively following the merits of being a member of the sangha. Once there was a program on EAP and after attending this program she decided to take up some income generating activity. Sharadamma discussed about this with sangha members and finally made up her mind to go for rice business, for this she borrowed Rs 5000/-as internal loan from the sangha and started rice business in a small scale.

Within few months she got knack of the trade and her business started improving, by this time she had saved Rs. 10,000/-, Smt. Sharadamma wanted to further expand her business, in addition to her savings she required some more money as capital to invest on the trade for which she approached SAMRUDI and availed Rs. 15,000/- as small enterprise loan. With a total of Rs, 25,000/- Sharadamma started buying rice in larger quantities directly from the rice mills in Sindhanoor at much cheaper rates, so that the profit margin is higher, With this kind of planned approach to the business she is at present earning Rs. 8,000/- to Rs. 10,000/- a month.

Now that she has gained experience, well versed in management of money and trade and also she is into business full time Sharadamma thought of adding one more enterprise to her trade, she has started investing her profits from rice trade on Cloth and Dress materials; she procures them from whole sellers in the district head quarters and sells in her neighboring villages for good profit.

Now she is fully engaged in her business and her financial position is comfortable such that she can afford to provide all that is required to her children and see the family is happy. If this is her personnel position in the society, she is a role model to her group members, neighbors and others; many are inspired and motivated by the way Smt. Sharadamma has been able to put an end to the condition she was in and finding solution by becoming a member in the SHG gaining awareness and knowledge to survive in the society with dignity and a model to others; She has become so confident she is an adviser to those in distress. She does not hesitate to express her gratitude to her sangha members, Diocese and SAMRUDI for their contribution in her progress and achievement.
